International Property Maintenance Code

- Adopted by State as a permissive code
- Must be adopted by the jurisdiction by name
 Covers all processes that is needed to manage Code Enforcement Department
- Regulates both structures and property
- Applicable to Residential and Commercial
- Remember these are minimum standards
- Note: not for new construction



Adoption of the International Property **Maintenance Code**

- Local adoption is critical to enforcement
- Without proper adoption the code enforcement department has no authority to act
- Model legislation can be found in the beginning of the code
- Make sure that you include jurisdiction specific items in "Section 2"
- Modifications can be made by the jurisdiction
- Make sure to setup a Board of Appeals

IMPC covers minimum standards for:

- Exterior property
- Swimming Pools
- Exterior Structure
- Interior Structure
- Rubbish and Garbage
- Pest Elimination
- Occupancy limitations
- Plumbing systems
- standards
- Fire safety
- Mechanical and electrical

Effective Code Enforcement

- Follow IMPC guidelines for Notices and Orders
- Have a helpful attitude
- Use the court system as a means to compliance
- Be prepared to pay for compliance when necessary
